PART 1 — INTERNET & CONNECTIVITY (Remote Work Priority)

What Remote Workers *Must* Know

- ♦ Reliable, high-speed internet is *non-negotiable*.
- ♦ Hawaii's infrastructure has improved significantly, but **availability varies by island, town, and neighborhood**.

Internet Options in Hawaii (2026)

Hawaiian Telcom (Fiber)

- Best choice where available — **true fiber with symmetrical upload/download speeds** ideal for Zoom, cloud work, backups.
- Plans often *faster and more reliable* than basic cable and come with competitive pricing.
- Coverage is strongest on **Oahu's urban and suburban areas**, with expansion to neighbor islands still in progress.

Spectrum (Cable)

- Widely available in urban and tourist hubs (Honolulu, Kahului, etc.).
- Reliable broadband for typical remote tasks — though upload speeds are often lower than with fiber.

Starlink / Satellite

- Game-changer for rural locations or off-grid living where fiber/cable won't reach.
- Great for remote spots on **Big Island, Kauai, Molokai, and remote parts of Maui**.

📌 **Pro Tip:** Always *check internet availability at the exact address* before deciding on a home or rental.

PART 2 — HOUSING & COST OF LIVING

General Reality Check

- Hawaii has some of the highest housing costs **in the U.S.**, with major islands far above national averages.
- Rentals and homeownership both come with premium prices.



Island-by-Island Housing Snapshot

Island	Home Price / Rent	Vibe for Remote Workers
Oahu	Very high (esp. Honolulu)	Strong amenities, coworking, urban lifestyle — but expensive.
Maui	High, especially coastal / resort areas	Beautiful landscape, good internet in main towns, limited long-term rentals.
Kauai	High relative to Big Island	Quiet, nature-rich, slower pace — good if connectivity is confirmed.
Big Island	Most affordable of the main four	BEST budget option for remote workers. Relies on <i>exact location</i> for good internet.

📌 Big Island (Hilo/Puna) often offers the *most budget-friendly* housing, though internet quality can vary by neighborhood.

📌 *Important Trend:* Local housing policy changes — like Maui's phasing out of many short-term rentals — are shifting long-term availability and prices for residents (includes remote workers). ([SFGATE](#))

PART 3 — COST OF LIVING BEYOND HOUSING

Typical Monthly Costs

💡 Rents can range widely (\$1,600–\$3,000+ for a 1-bed) depending on location.

💡 Utilities, groceries, and internet are all above mainland averages.

💡 Many remote workers need earned income of \$70k+ to live comfortably.

Transportation & Logistics:

- Owning a car is almost essential on most islands outside of Honolulu; public transit options are limited.
- Shipping delays/costs affect everyday goods.



PART 4 — LIFESTYLE & COMMUNITY FIT

Oahu

✓ Best infrastructure, coworking, healthcare, social opportunities.

✗ Most expensive and crowded.

Maui

✓ Ideal for nature lovers and quieter remote life.

✗ Housing flux due to policy and wildfire recovery; internet less ubiquitous outside hubs.

Kauai

✓ Lush, peaceful, slower pace.

✗ Limited urban amenities and potentially spotty connectivity in rural zones.

Big Island

✓ Most affordable; biggest variety of landscapes and lifestyles.

✗ Requires careful planning for internet and services depending on locale.

Molokai / Lanai

- Ultra-low-key, remote living — minimal infrastructure. Best for off-grid or sabbatical style remote work.
- Less ideal for consistent broadband needs.

Essential Checklist for Remote Workers Before You Move

- ☐ Visit *for extended stays* (30+ days) to test internet and lifestyle fit.R
- ☐ Confirm exact internet availability at your intended address.L
- ☐ Budget for higher living costs than the mainland.L
- ☐ Explore local community groups and meetups to connect socially and professionally.a
- ☐ Plan for car transport if living outside of Honolulu.L
